Saturday 15th - Saturday 22nd October 2016

Free events, demos, walks and talks all about Filey's amazing birdlife





<u>Every day from dawn til dusk</u> - Bird ringing in the Country Park (weather permitting*) - come and see everything from tiny Goldcrests to birds of prey in the hand, and learn all about their amazing lives and journeys from our experts... All welcome, and great for kids – **drop by any time!**

Second-hand bird books and reports will be for sale at the ringing station all week – all proceeds to St Catherine's Hospice (good quality donations also welcome)

Saturday 15th

1000hrs - **Birds of the Brigg guided walk**: see shorebirds, seabirds and more up close, and learn all about their lifestyles and how to identify them. (Warning - uneven and slippery surfaces!). Meet at the ringing station.

1500hrs – **Birds of Filey Dams guided walk**: a leisurely look at the waterbirds of this wonderful wetland reserve. Learn about their amazing migrations, how to identify them and more! (Wheelchair accessible and mostly from sheltered hides.) Meet at the Dams car park.

1930hrs – Evening talk – 'Siberia to Filey Migration Express – how do birds do it?' by Richard Baines – free entry, but BOOKING ESSENTIAL due to very cosy venue (!) – contact Mark (details below) to reserve your place.

Sunday 16th

1400hrs – **Birds of Filey Dams guided walk**: a leisurely look at the waterbirds of this wonderful wetland reserve. Learn about their migrations, ecology and much more! (Wheelchair accessible and mostly from hides). Meet Dams car park. Followed by.... **Discover East Lea**: an exclusive chance to visit our East Lea wetland reserve, just ten minutes walk from the Dams (not wheelchair accessible). Just stay with us at the end of the Dams walk!

Tuesday 18th

1600-1730hrs - Bird identification drop-in session at Filey Dams. Ducks, geese, gulls, waders, songbirds and more ask away and let our ID experts help you with the basics! Come to the east pool hide and we'll have optics and field guides available.

Thursday 20th

1900hrs — 'Filey International - arrivals and departures at North Yorkshire's Bird Observatory' - a talk by Mark Pearson at Filey library, 6.45 for a 7pm start. Learn all about why we're famous for welcoming birds from around the globe on their epic journeys with a whistlestop tour through four seasons of action! Booking not required.

Saturday 22nd

1000hrs – **Bird migration guided walk**: a gentle 'walking talk' on Carr Naze and nearby, looking at migrating birds, learning about their amazing journeys and how to identify them. Meet at the ringing station.

1500hrs – **Birds of Filey Dams guided walk**: a leisurely look at the waterbirds of this wonderful wetland reserve. Learn about their amazing migrations, how to identify them and much more! Wheelchair accessible and mostly from sheltered hides. Meet at the Dams car park.

1930hrs – Evening talk - 'Bird ringing in Filey – the week in review and what we've learned' by Pete Dunn – free entry, but BOOKING ESSENTIAL due to very cosy venue (!) – contact Mark (details below) to reserve your place.

Directions to the ringing station: At Filey Country Park, take the left-hand track immediately after the cafe. Follow the track on foot for 150m and you'll see us on your right.

Directions to Filey Dams: From Muston Road (A1039), turn onto Wharfedale and follow it to the end, where a small car park is at the reserve entrance.

All outdoor events are weather dependent and late changes may also be required - check FBOG.CO.UK the evening before for confirmation or changes to the schedule
